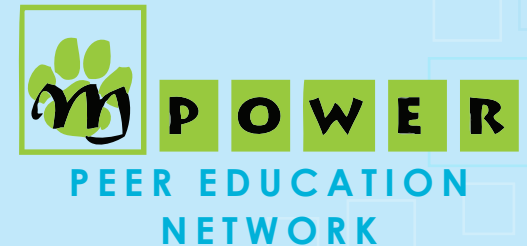

### ODU SART

The ODU Sexual Assault Resource Team (SART) is a coordinated team of professionals committed to providing sexual assault resources, support services, and education for ODU students, faculty and staff. The SART plays a critical role in keeping sexual assault policy and protocol current and effective.



The M-POWER Peer Education Network serves the student body at ODU as an educational resource on the issues of sexual and relationship violence. Peer educators engage their fellow students in programs and discussions that promote gender equity and anti-violence.

# Support for you or a friend...

## If you are a survivor of relationship or sexual violence:

- You are not alone. Contact the Women's Center SAFE Coordinator to talk about options and resources.
- Most sexual and relationship violence is committed by someone the victim knows. You may feel confused and betrayed.
- The assault or abuse is not your fault.
- You may experience many common, normal reactions: guilt, shame, disbelief, fear, denial, anger and physical symptoms (trouble sleeping, appetite shifts, headaches, stomach aches).
- Remember to be kind to yourself. The healing process takes time and recovery is possible.
- If you are supporting a victim/survivor of sexual assault or abuse, listen and be non-judgmental. Contact the SAFE Coordinator for support and resources.
